2019 LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS

ARKANSAS LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. All animals entering the grounds, including those showing in pet zoos, children's barnyard animals, Old McDonalds Farms, etc. must meet the requirements of their particular species.

2. Arkansas Livestock, (except for Arkansas sheep, goats, horses, steers, and rabbits) must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within 90 days prior to exhibition, showing the following:

ARKANSAS CATTLE

1. If Arkansas is a Class Free State, Arkansas cattle are exempt from brucellosis testing. If Arkansas is not a Class Free State, then the following testing requirements must be met: Negative brucellosis test within 90 days prior to exhibition for females and bulls 18 months of age and over. All heifers that have calved or are bred must be tested. Animals originating from a Certified Brucellosis Free Herd are exempt if the Certified Free Herd number is shown on certificate.

2. All heifers that are 4-12 months of age shall be vaccinated before entering show.

3. Heifers that were born on or after January 1, 1985, that are over 12 months of age and are not official calf hood vaccinates will not be allowed to show (unless they are from a Brucellosis Certified Free Herd,) This will not apply if Arkansas continues as a Brucellosis Free State

4. All rodeo stock exhibited at a rodeo in Arkansas must meet the out of state requirements for brucellosis and tuberculosis for (12) month and older bulls, roping and dogging steers, and heifers even if the rodeo stock originates from Arkansas. Tie down roping calves are exempt from the tuberculosis testing requirements. The exception is a CVI within the state is good for ninety (90) days instead of thirty days.

ARKANSAS SWINE

1. As of July 1, 2001, all swine must have an official premise identification.

2. Animals six (6) months old or older to be tested negative for brucellosis within ninety (90) days of exhibition or originate directly out of a Validated Herd, with Validation number and date of last herd test shown on certificate (barrows exempt from brucellosis testing but must be pseudorabies tested.)

3. Animals to be tested negative for pseudorabies regardless of age within ninety (90) days of the exhibition on a test approved by the State Veterinarian or originate directly out of a Qualified Pseudorabies Free Herd, with Qualified Herd number and date of last test shown on certificate.

4. Free of other contagious, infectious, and communicable diseases (erysipelas, atrophic rhinitis, etc.); otherwise they will not be allowed to show and will be released from fairgrounds.

ARKANSAS SHEEP AND GOATS

Exhibition officials must maintain records of all sheep and goats that are exhibited for a period of five years to include:

- a) Identification Number
- b) Flock status as defined by the Voluntary Flock Certification Program

c) The name, complete address and phone number of the owner.

All instate sheep and goats in the state of Arkansas must be identified by an official USDA tag scrapie tag) or for goats a legible official goat registry tattoo if accompanied by a registration certificate.

Fair personnel, veterinarians, or state-federal personnel may examine sheep on grounds. Any sheep showing clinical symptoms of Scrapie shall be immediately quarantined in isolation and required to undergo any approved diagnostic test and shall be consigned to slaughter or destruction with submission of tissues to an approved diagnostic laboratory at the exhibitor's expense.

Commingling (as defined by the Arkansas Scrapie Regulation) of sheep or goats of different flock status as defined by the Voluntary Flock Certification Program (VFCP) is prohibited and must be reported to the VFCP state official and State Veterinarian.

No sheep or goats showing symptoms of disease, particularly foot rot, sore mouth, sheep pox, evidence of fungal infection, evidence of abscesses or with draining abscesses will be allowed to show and may be released by fair officials, veterinarians, or state- federal personnel

ARKANSAS RABBITS

Rabbits will be inspected on the grounds. No rabbits showing symptoms of disease will be allowed to show.

ARKANSAS HORSES

Negative EIA test required within the past twelve (12) months for all animals over 6 months of age. Nursing foals under 6 months of age are exempt from testing if accompanied by negative tested dams. Photocopies of the test papers will not be accepted; carbon copies are acceptable.

The Van Buren County Fair Association may request any health papers or certificates we deem necessary when participating in any equine (horse) related event, On or OFF the Van Buren County Fair Grounds, sanctioned by the Van Buren County Livestock Show & Fair Association.

ARKANSAS CERVIDS

- 1. Certificate of veterinary inspection.
- 2. Negative clerical tuberculosis test within ninety (90) days.
- 3. Negative brucellosis test within ninety (90) days.
- 4. Or originate from a Certified Brucellosis-Free and Accredited Tuberculosis Cervids Herd
- 5. Or originate from a Brucellosis-Monitored and a Qualified Tuberculosis Herd within ninety (90) days of exhibition.

ARKANSAS CAMELIDS

- 1. Individually identified, and certificate of veterinary inspection within ninety (90) days of exhibition.
- 2. Registration papers when accompanied by registry photographs of the animal are acceptable identification.

ARKANSAS RATITES

- 1. Certificate of veterinary inspection.
- 2. Negative avian influenza test within ninety (90) days.
- 3. Permanent identification.

ARKANSAS POULTRY

An official representing the exhibition shall notify the state veterinarian no later than thirty (30) days prior to the exhibition, giving names, place, inclusive dates, and time of the event.

The requirements are as follows:

1. All in-state poultry, which includes domesticated game birds, quail, pheasants, peafowl, guineas, and turkeys, present at exhibition in Arkansas shall have originated from U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent flocks or have had negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within (90) days of the movement to the exhibition (Pullorum Typhoid testing on fairgrounds during the fair is prohibited.). This information will be documented on a NPIP from VS 9-3, 90-day certificate, NPIP Flock Certification Form or similar certificate which will accompany the poultry during the exhibition.

2. All non-certified birds must be banded (leg or wing band), with a sealed band. Wrap-around plastic bands are not acceptable. In-state waterfowl are exempt from pullorum-typhoid requirements.

3.Any poultry showing evidence of infectious or contagious disease or insect infestation will not be permitted to exhibit.

4. Record Keeping-The sponsor of the exhibition shall compile a list of all poultry present at the exhibition This list shall contain the name and address of each owner, the number, the species, the breed, variety, type, sex and Pullorum-Typhoid status of all poultry present. A copy of this list shall be retained by the sponsor of the exhibition for at least twelve (12) months.

General Rules & Regulations

1. The Van Buren County Fair Association follows all the rules and regulations of the Arkansas State fair concerning ownership, classes, health regulations, and number of entries. The only exceptions to this is the Horse Show, Prospect Steer Show, and The Van Buren County bred pig show. IF YOU CAN SHOW IT AT THE ARKANSAS STATE FAIR YOU CAN SHOW IT HERE. IF YOU CAN NOT SHOW IT AT THE ARKANSAS STATE FAIR YOU CAN SHOW IT HERE SORRY.

2.ALL ANIMALS EXCEPT POULTRY, RABBITS, AND MARKET STEERS MUST BE OWNED BY THE EXHIBITOR BY JULY 15th,2019 AND REGISTERED IN THE OWNERS NAME TO BE ALLOWED TO SHOW. MARKET STEERS MUST BE OWNED BY MAY 15Th 2019. (HOW EVER IF YOU ARE ENTERING A MARKET HOG, MARKET LAMB OR MARKET GOAT IN THE AKRANSAS STATE FAIR THE OWNERSHIP DEADLINE FOR THE ARKANSAS STATE FAIR IS 7/1/19 FOR THOSE ANIMALS BUT 7/15/19 FOR THE VAN BUREN COUNTY FAIR)

3. All exhibitors of livestock with the exception of poultry and rabbits

must be present to show their entries in the proper class unless approved by the Livestock Superintendent. Junior exhibitors will show their own animals. If they have more than one animal in a class another junior may assist. If a Junior exhibitor is sick, injured, has a death in the family or serious family illness or is involved in another school function at the time of the show the Livestock Superintendent will allow another Junior exhibitor to show their animal.

4. Entries must be pre-registered by September 1, 2019 with the livestock superintendent, Wesley A. Hall, phone # (501) 314-6508, address: 5330 Hwy 124, Damascus, AR 72039. Or Dikelin Evans phone# (501) 412-7798, address 334 southside road Bee Branch Arkansas. 72013. Twelve dollars per head entry fees must accompany Entries form.

5. All animals must be properly groomed before entering show arena.

6.Van Buren County Fair Association will not furnish feed, hay, bedding, or water containers for the livestock.

7. The Livestock Superintendent reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit or animal that may be falsely entered or deemed unsuitable or objectionable without assigning a reason.

8. Each exhibitor is responsible for having his/her animal(s) presented in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification, except for the grooming of hair and hooves. Anyone violating this rule will be required to return all premium money and could be banned from further competition.

9. All Horses, Goats, Sheep and Dairy Cattle must be entered in on Monday 9/16/19 by 5 p.m., All Beef Cattle, Swine, Poultry, and Rabbits must be entered in Wednesday 9/18/19 between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. with the superintendent and with the required health papers and/ or registration papers or animals will not be allowed to be unloaded.

10.All Horses, Goats, Sheep and Dairy Cattle will be released at the end of their show. All other livestock will be released at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 21, 2019.

11. Junior exhibitors will exhibit in Junior Show only. Open exhibitors will exhibit in Open Show only. Junior exhibitors may assist in showing open Exhibitors animals in the Open Show.

12. Ages of exhibitors entering a showmanship contest will be set as of how old that you are on Monday 9/16/19 the opening day of the fair which is the horse show.

13. Exhibitors are allowed to show for both Grand and Reserve Grand Champion in any show regardless of any livestock premium auction rules however only one animal will be allowed to be sold in the livestock premium auction.

14. See all the other rules that apply to your species of animal

15. BECAUSE THE VAN BUREN COUNTY FAIR DOES NOT FOLLOW THE STATE VET POLICY OF THE ARKANSAS STATE FAIR : OWNERS, AGRI TEACHERS, 4H ADVISORS, THE LIVESTOCK SUPERINTENDENT, PARENTS OR GRAND PARENTS ARE ALLOWED TO GIVE THEIR ANIMALS ANY SHOTS OR MEDICINE NECESSARY ON THE VAN BUREN COUNTY FAIR GROUNDS. SINCE SOMETIMES IT IS NECESSARY TO GIVE MEDICINE BY DRENCHING, DRENCHING OF ANIMALS IS ALLOWED ON THE VAN BUREN COUNTY FAIR GROUNDS EVEN IF IT IS JUST FOR SHOW PURPOSES

16. BECAUSE THIS IS A LEARNING AND EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCE AND ALL OF US TRY TO TEACH OUR KIDS COACHING WHILE A EXHIBITOR IS IN THE SHOW RING IS ALLOWED HOWEVER THIS SHOULD BE DONE IN A RESPECTFUL MANNER AS TO NOT DISTRACT THE JUDGE OR THE OTHER EXHIBITORS IN THE SHOW RING. PLEASE ACT PROFESSIONAL WHILE DOING THIS AND HAVE RESPECT FOR THE OTHER EXHIBITORS, FAIR PERSONAL, THE JUDGE, PARENTS AND GRAND PARENTS BOTH IN THE SHOW RING AND AROUND THE SHOW RING WHILE COACHING YOUR CHILDREN OR STUDENTS THANK YOU.

17. EXHIBITORS ARE ALLOWED TO SHOW AT ONLY 1 COUNTY FAIR. IT DOES NOT HAVE TO BE THE COUNTY THAT YOU LIVE IN.

18. THE VAN BUREN COUNTY FAIR ASSOC & LIVESTOCK SUPERINTENDENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ADD TO ANY OF THESE RULES OR MAKE ANY CHANGES NECESSARY AT ANY TIME. THE LIVESTOCK SUPERINTENDENT WORD IS FINAL.

1. A 5% Commission will be taken out of ALL funds taken in through the Livestock Premium Sale, Add on money to certain places and Add on money at large to purchase buyers plaques, Grand Championship Belt Buckles and for discretionary show expenses deemed needed by the Livestock Committee.

2. The number and type of sale animals will follow the list below if numbers warrant in the Junior Show.

3.Animals will be set in at market value and sold to the highest bidder. The exhibitor reserves the right to keep his/her animal.

4. At the end of the premium auction a LIVE auction will begin any Junior exhibitor wishing to outright sell his /her animal will be given the opportunity to do so. The owner of the animal will set the opening bid. If no one bids the animal does not sale. (This is limited to market animals only. These animals will be released to the new owner immediately following the sale.

5. Each exhibitor is limited to one animal in the Premium Auction. If more than one animal qualifies, the exhibitor will have the right to choose which one he/she wants to sell. **IF A EXHIBITOR HAS MORE THAN ONE ANIMAL QUALIFIED FOR THE PREMIUM SALE NO OTHER SHOWS WILL BE ALLOWED TO BEGIN UNTIL THE EXHIBITOR HAS RELEASED ONE OF HIS ANIMALS FROM THE PREMIUM SALE.**

6. If rule #5 occurs, the next animal in that species, will then qualify for the Premium Auction. (The judge will be instructed

to select several alternate animals of each species for when this occurs.)

7. All animals involved with the Jr. Premium Auction must meet the weight qualifications stipulated in the rules stated in the respected qualified areas. Any exhibitor's animal not meeting the stipulations of these rules will be prohibited from participating in the Jr. Auction.
